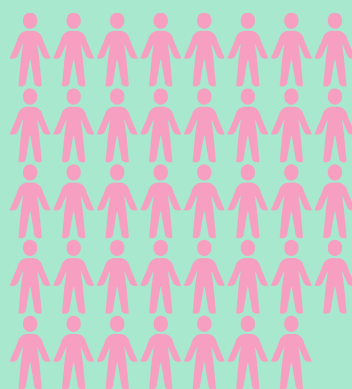

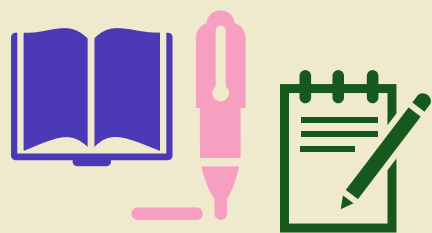
3% of this total (£3748/£3381) is being used towards participatory budgeting.
